### OXFORD

Oxford is a beautiful city, famous for its splendid buildings, its lovely streets and its fascinating past.

#### A brief history

There was a famous market situated in the centre of Oxford, where all the villagers and townspeople sold and bought things. Oxford is well-known for its centres of learning since the 12<sup>th</sup> century. For example, Oxford University was formally established in 1250, making it the oldest in Britain.

#### What to do in Oxford

One of the most exciting things you can do in Oxford is punting. The punt is the traditional boat in Oxford and Cambridge. It is a long, narrow boat, ideal for using on the quiet waters of the rivers in these cities. Punts can be hired in different places along the river, and it is a good way to see most of the University colleges.

#### What to see in Oxford

The University and College buildings are the most popular attractions and all of them can be visited from Monday to Sunday. There are also other interesting places you can visit. Oxford cathedral, for example, is the smallest in England: founded in the 6<sup>th</sup> century, only some parts of the original church are now visible. Visits: Monday-Saturday: 9am-4pm. Sunday: 9am-1pm, free entrance.

#### Where to eat and drink in Oxford

There are many interesting and nice places for having lunch, tasty snacks and dinner in Oxford. *The Covered Market*, for example, has numerous cafés and other places to eat. *Le Bistro* restaurant has a daily lunch meal at a reasonable price. *Browns*, in Woodstock Road, is open from midday and offers coffee, lunches and dinner in, perhaps, the most popular place to eat in the city.
